

Long Acting Reversible Contraceptive (LARC) Billing Guide

General Information

Miami Children's Health Plan (MCHP) is supporting Florida Medicaid's goal of improving birth outcomes by participating in the Access LARC (Long Acting Reversible Contraceptive) initiative through the Florida Perinatal Quality Collaborative. Research shows that LARCs are effective in reducing unintended pregnancies, premature and low birth weight births, and prenatal drug exposure.

MCHP's objective is to implement policy and payment changes to facilitate access to reproductive life alternatives including the use of LARCs.

This document is intended as a billing guide for LARC devices on UB-04 claims and how to receive separate reimbursement for LARC devices provided immediately postpartum in the inpatient setting.

Inpatient Reimbursement Methodology

- Contract amendment will be required for reimbursement of LARC.
- Covered services will be reimbursed at 100% of the current Florida Medicaid in addition to the DRG reimbursement for labor and delivery.
- The appropriate HCPC codes listed or it's replacement HCPCs code, under revenue code 636, including the proper number of units as defined by the HCPCs code definition, must be included in the UB-04 billed claim.

HCPC Codes

Code	Description
J7296	Levonorgestrel-releasing intrauterine contraceptive system, (kyleena), 19.5 mg
J7297	Levonorgestrel-releasing intrauterine contraceptive system (liletta), 52 mg
J7298	Levonorgestrel-releasing intrauterine contraceptive system (mirena), 52 mg
J7300	Intrauterine copper contraceptive
J7301	Levonorgestrel-releasing intrauterine contraceptive system (skyla), 13.5 mg
J7307	Etonogestrel (contraceptive) implant system, including implant and supplies
